At the September 6, 2006 Final Budget Hearings, the Board requested a report back regarding the Del Norte Park District, including the possibility of dissolution of the District or consolidation with the County's Landscape Maintenance District.

#### **Description of District**

Del Norte Oaks Park Maintenance District was formed in 1967 pursuant to Resolution 67-9-71. The money it receives is an allocation of property tax; the District does not levy an assessment. The amount of the original assessment, \$2,438, remains unchanged since its formation in the late 1960's. Regional Parks is responsible for maintaining the District. The District's maintenance costs exceed available funding and Parks draws from its General Fund allocation to maintain the District at a marginally acceptable level.

The purpose of the District was to construct and maintain a landscaped buffer between the new housing development (Del Norte Oaks Subdivision) and existing residents on Whitney Avenue. The 33 houses located within the Del Norte Oaks Subdivision fund the assessment; the landscaped area is actually located behind the subdivision houses.

#### Location

Del Norte Oaks Park Maintenance District is located at the corner of Whitney Avenue and Norris Avenue (map attached). Total developed acres are 8,200 square feet. The landscaping consists of ivy and trees (see photos). Regional Parks Contract Maintenance Staff from North Corporation Yard provide the maintenance services.

### Scope of Parks' Maintenance Services

Regional Parks has assigned three staff (two temporary and one permanent), once a week to perform maintenance services. Their duties include trash collection and removal, tearing ivy from fence, repairs to irrigation, trimming ivy from sidewalk, and responding to vandalism/graffiti. The challenges for maintenance staff include pools draining into the landscaped area killing the landscaping, fences falling down, repairs to irrigation and landscaping due to cars running off the road, and the aged trees and landscaping. Since staff visits the site only once a week, problems are not detected until the landscaping begins to die or graffiti has been present for several days.

Costs for staff and supplies are \$5,958 for a minimum level of service, creating an <u>annual</u> funding gap for the <u>District of \$3,520</u>. Detailed budget is attached.

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## **Alternatives for Funding**

Bill Burke, Office of County Counsel, outlined several alternatives to address the funding gap. In summary, those alternatives were as follows:

- Increase Assessment
  - To increase the Assessment, the residents within Del Norte Oaks would need to approve the fee increase (Proposition 218). It is unlikely that the Del Norte Oaks residents would approve such an increase since they do not benefit directly from the district; the landscaped area is behind their homes.
- Consolidation, Annexation

The district could be consolidated or annexed with another district, but if the affect was an increase in the fee, Proposition 218 would apply again.

- Bond Issuance
  - Bonds could be issued for improvements to the district, but not used for ongoing maintenance services.
- Dissolution

The County could dissolve the District, but the district's lands would remain and no provision for maintenance of the lands would exist. In carrying out the dissolution process, the County would need to make provisions if a majority protest occurs.


