Will change contract to pooled authority so it will not be \$50,000 from each contract. We will meet with Providers next week to work on the specific reductions. They could include some of the following: reduce or eliminate non- threshold language interpreters reduce or eliminate community outreach activities to non-target population eliminate home visits to non-target population and/or non-threshold languages reduce translation services (documents) to County MH staff Reduce travel time and cost associated with translation & outreach services, increase phone consultation time to public at large, Increase community contact at service providers (APCC, SAAC) location. |
